WHAT IS FIRE DAMAGE

Fire Damage is One of the Leading Causes of U.S. Property Insurance Claims

Fire damage refers to the physical damage to a property as a result of burning. This damage may either be directly caused by the flames or could occur due to smoke and other corrosive substances emitted by the fire.



Did you know?

Fire damage can continue to destroy your property even after the fire is out. Soot is difficult to remove and will stain and/or corrode possessions making them unsalvageable. That's why response time is such a critical factor in how well fire damage can be removed and reversed.





WHAT IS SMOKE & SOOT DAMAGE

Smoke damage is the physical damage caused by smoke that's generated by a fire, not the damage caused by the fire itself.

Caused by the remnants of the fuel that fed the fire, smoke does not destroy items like fire does. Instead, it coats objects in soot and odor. Response time is a critical factor in how effective fire damage can be removed and reversed.



Soot can be very oily and highly acidic, making it nearly impossible to remove without professional tools and methods.

Smoke residues combine with humidity to form acids that can stain grout, paint, bath fixtures, kitchen counter tops and many appliances.



PREPARING FOR FIRE DISASTERS



DEVELOP A FIRE PREPAREDNESS PLAN

Property fires can be devastating. Both big and small fires can have huge affects on the inhabitants. It's important to avoid hazardous situations and develop a disaster preparedness plan. Visit <u>ready.gov</u> for more emergency preparedness information and download your plan template.

6 Ways to Prepare for a Property Fire:

- 1. Install & Test Smoke Alarms (2x annually)
- 2. Teach children what an alarm sounds like and what to do
- 3. Prepare a disaster plan: ensure everyone knows at least 2 ways to escape and designate a meeting spot
- 4. Practice your two escape routes at least twice a year
- 5. Make sure everyone knows how to dial 9-1-1
- 6. Teach household members to STOP DROP and ROLL









Post Emergency Evacuation Routes in Public Areas of All Buildings on Property

Ensure that all area residents and facility occupants are aware of the various escape routes by having these posted in common areas (Follow OSHA Guidelines). Plan to host a quarterly fire/escape drill to practice these routes.



Consider Your Community's Specific Needs

Set up how you'll receive and distribute your hazardous conditions alerts to area residents. Provide information for a local shelter, area evacuation route, and create emergency preparedness kits (water, snacks, flashlights, etc.) for residents to have ready to go.



Provide Residents with Emergency Services Contacts

Disasters never wait, and strike when you're least expecting them to. Make sure your residents know who to contact in an emergency!



Install Fire & CO2 Detectors in All Public Areas

Carbon monoxide & fire detectors safe lives be sure to test all onsite detectors at least twice annually.



WHAT DO YOU DO DURING A FIRE EMERGENCY?

Your first reaction should be to grab your keys, alert the people around you and exit the property premises as quickly as possible.

Act immediately but try and stay calm. Stay low when exiting in case of smoke or fumes and do not waste time searching for valuables.





Follow these easy steps to ensure you're limiting the damage caused until a firefighter and restoration expert can intervene ...



THE DO'S & DO NOT'S OF FIRE DISASTERS

DO NOT:

- Re-enter your property until trained professionals arrive and the Fire Marshal has cleared you to do so!
- Waste time searching for valuables
- Attempt to extinguish a fire unless you are trained to do so!
- Ever use an elevator as an escape route
- Remove items from your property after you're able to re-enter - these items need to be cleaned
- Leave any fire/smoke doors open during an evacuation
- Use water to put out a grease fire
- · Remain inside a building even if fire has been contained
- Forget to keep spare medicines, water and snacks along with important paperwork in your vehicle, or fire safe container.

DO:

- ✓ Make sure to wake everyone up by alerting "FIRE!
- ✔ Everyone Out!" Pull property alarms when necessary
- ✓ Know the location of your properties fire extinguisher and safely operate if small and contained fire
- ✓ After you have safely exited the property, call for help!
- ✓ Close doors and windows on your way out to prevent spread of fire damage
- ✓ Stay low to the ground to avoid smoke inhalation
- ✓ Grab a flashlight as you are exiting to avoid hazardous obstacles
- ✓ Keep important paperwork in a fire-proof lock-box
- ✓ Have an emergency preparedness plan in place for evacuations know your meeting spot and get there quickly


